



Methodology

The analysis in this report is based on results of a survey conducted from Tuesday, April 25th to Wednesday, April 26th, 2023, among a sample of 996 adults, 18 years of age or older, living in Toronto. The survey was conducted using automated telephone interviews (Smart IVR). Respondents were interviewed on landlines and cellular phones. The survey is intended to represent the voting population in Toronto. The poll was conducted in English.

The margin of error for the poll is +/- 3.1% at the 95% confidence level. Margins of error are higher in each subsample. Totals may not add up 100% due to rounding.



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

If the mayoral election were held today, which candidate would you vote for? (Decided and Undecided)





If the mayoral election were held today, which candidate would you vote for? (Decided voters)




