
#### Methodology

The analysis in this report is based on results of a survey conducted from Wednesday, October 19th to Friday, October 21st, 2022, among a sample of 398 adults, 18 years of age or older, living in Brampton. The survey was conducted using automated telephone interviews (Smart IVR). Respondents were interviewed on landlines and cellular phones. The survey is intended to represent the voting population in Brampton.

The margin of error for the poll is +/- 4.9% at the 95% confidence level. Margins of error are higher in each subsample.







Do you approve or disapprove of Patrick Brown's performance as Mayor over the past 4 years? (all voters, Brampton)



# Thinking about local issues, do you support or oppose a property tax freezes? (all voters, Brampton)



# Do you support or oppose Highway 413? (all voters, Brampton)




